


# Secret sports

# 1 Work in small teams. Choose a name for your team. Write the words under the pictures. There are more words than you need.




2 Choose a sport for your team. You can use a sport from exercise 1 or think of a new one. Write your sport in the first row of the list. Remember – it's a secret!




