# Make a butterfly kite

You need:



a large sheet of paper



2 wooden sticks



paints or crayons



scissors and sticky tape



a hole punch



string and ribbon



**1** Fold the piece of paper in half and draw half of a butterfly, with the body along the fold. Cut out the butterfly shape with the scissors.

**2** Decorate the butterfly with paints or crayons.

**3** Mark a hole near the top of the butterfly's body and cover the mark with sticky tape. Then make a hole with the hole punch.

**4** Put the string through the hole, and make a knot.

**5** Tape one stick along the middle of the butterfly and the other stick across the wings. Tape the ribbon to the bottom of the butterfly.
