How did Daedalus put the string through the shell? Tell a friend.







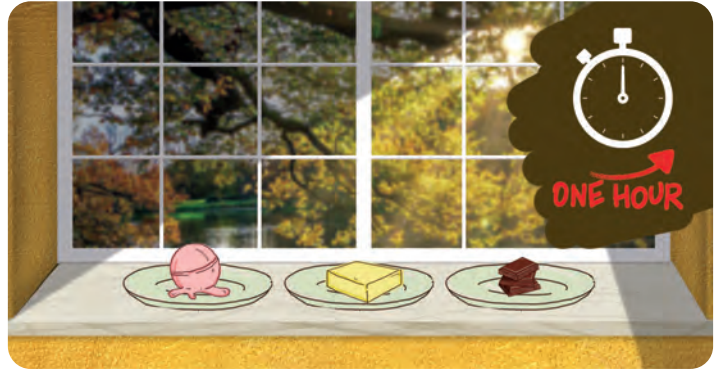
