Each decision you make leads you to a different version of the story and a unique ending: so choose carefully!

The man takes a small coin out of his pocket. He throws it at Tom, but it falls into a puddle. Tom jumps down into the road and quickly picks it up.

• bridge:

- **jumps**: (here) moves quickly
- picks up: takes in his hand

pocket:



- puddle: water on the road from rain
- shiny: clean and bright
- · throws: sends through the air



'Hey, you! Move out of my way!' shouts a man on a cart. The cart is full of meat pies and they look very good. Tom jumps up, then he runs behind the cart and takes a pie. The man doesn't see him.

'HEY!' shouts a policeman. 'STOP THIEF!'

Tom runs. He runs around the horses and jumps over the puddles. The policeman runs after him. Tom runs as guickly as he can.

'Stop that boy!' shouts the policeman. He blows his whistle, and Tom looks behind him. There are lots of policemen running after him now.

Tom runs across the street and jumps over some boxes by a fruit shop. He sees an alleyway. He runs into the alleyway and hides behind a big box. Now he can eat his pie!

Just as he's opening his mouth, he hears a noise. The policeman is walking towards him.

Tom thinks quickly and throws the pie in the policeman's face. Then he runs down the alleyway. It's very dark and there's a strange fog all around him. He can't see anything. But he can hear the policeman behind him. He runs and runs and runs. Until, BANG!

He runs into a wall at the end of the alleyway. Oh no! Tom puts his hands on the wall. He's looking for a door or a window. Yes! There's a door, but it's locked\*! No problem for Tom – he knows how to open locked doors. Tom works at the door for a moment, then – CLICK. The door opens and he goes inside. It's dark, and he can't see anything. The door closes behind him. He listens for the policeman, but everything is quiet.



#### Glossary

- blows: uses his mouth to force air and make a noise
- fog: thick low cloud when it is wet
- hides: goes where no one can see him
- · locked: shut with a key

- pies: type of food, often meat or vegetables that are covered in pastry and baked
- whistle: see picture above


