THE HOUSE OF HEROES BOOKS



'TYTO!' shouts the man and he walks towards a different door and out of the room. Then Tom sees something interesting on a table – a sandwich! Tom thinks of his meat pie and the policeman. He's very hungry. He waits for a moment and goes into the room and takes the sandwich. Then he hears the voice again – the man is coming back. Tom quickly hides behind a chair.

The man comes back into the room, then he walks around and around. Tom watches him from behind the chair. This time there is a big white owl sitting on his shoulder.

'Something bad is coming. I can feel it,' the man says quietly. '*TOOO-HOOO!*' cries[•] the white owl.

- around: to the left and to the right
- cloak: long coat
- cries: (here) makes a loud sound
- feather: see picture above
- **fireplace**: place in a room where you have a fire
- quiet: silent; without noise
- voice: sound when someone speaks

'Who are you? And what are you doing here?'


